Dear Huber Heights Resident,

The City of Huber Heights is committed to providing safe, reliable water and sewer service to every household and business in our community. Starting with your February 2026 bill, the average residential customer will see an increase of approximately \$23.50 on their combined water and sewer bill.

We understand that any rate increase can be a concern, and we want to explain why this change is necessary. It is essential that we continue to invest in maintaining and upgrading our water infrastructure, and we invest nearly \$9 million annually to maintain and operate our water system. This rate adjustment supports increased operating costs and numerous critical water projects, including main replacements, water tower maintenance and painting, and upgrading water meters. Future investments at our water treatment facility include filter improvements, membrane replacements, a new clearwell, SCADA system enhancements and production well improvements. These investments will ensure our drinking water system remains safe, reliable and efficient.

Additionally, this increase will improve our wastewater treatment and sewer infrastructure. Each year, we invest nearly \$4.5 million in our sewer collection and treatment systems. Over the next five years, improvements to our wastewater treatment system will be made through additional sewer pipe lining, replacing lift stations, and partnering with Tipp City and Vandalia to improve the Tri-Cities Wastewater Plant. These improvements are necessary due to an aging system and to comply with EPA water quality regulations.

The City has not implemented a water and sewer rate increase of this size in many years, and we have worked diligently to keep costs low. The recent 2025 Piqua Annual Rate Survey, which compares 70 regional communities, confirms that Huber Heights' combined water and sewer rates are currently the 5th lowest in the entire area. **Even with this increase**, our rates will remain regionally competitive and lower than many surrounding communities.
